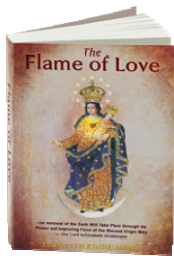

Fall is here and the weather now meets the season. We begin to see the leaves changing colors and falling to the ground. There is great

beauty in the colors of the trees; yet, as the leaves fall, we feel a sense of sadness. When I was in elementary school, I remember Sister telling us that the fallen leaves are food for the soil which will eventually bring about spring beauty. So, while we watch the leaves fall, we know they are being put to good use. It is also a time to reap the harvest of plenty, and to give thanks to God for all of our gifts. Happy Fall!

Yesterday, I visited Mrs. Conricode's first graders. They were on the ipads writing stories using their vocabulary words. Then they made illustrations to their creative stories. Watching them, I was amazed that they were able to explain what they were doing. I was also amazed at how easily they were able to use the ipads.

Today, the Kindergarteners were with their prayer partners working on projects. I love watching the older students working with the younger ones and how attentive they are to them.

The Pre-K four children visited Solly Farms yesterday. They went on a hayride and said they saw the Great Pumpkin! They came back excited and exhausted. The chaperones were definitely exhausted.

The fourth graders were in the computer lab working on the new laptops. They were learning how to type using a program that was fun and easy. They were very eager to get 100% accuracy. They were also able to learn how many words they were typing per minute. I learned that in high school!

Our 8th graders are pondering their futures as they look into various high schools to attend. We had seventeen out of forty-six 8th graders who qualified to take the Neumann Scholarship Test. In order to qualify to take this test, the students needed a general average of 92 or above on their 7th grade report cards and a CSI of 120 or above. Last Sunday the students took the test and the remainder will take the test next Sunday. If a student becomes a Neumann Scholar, they receive full tuition to an Archdiocesan high school of their choice. We are very proud of them!

As you can see, the school is vibrant and so much good learning is happening. Thank you for all of your support and encouragement!
